Hints from Heloise

Chocolate cake a tomato surprise

Dear Heloise: Years ago, there was a recipe for CHOCOLATE TOMATO CAKE that was wonderful. I lost the recipe that was published in The (Newark, N.J.) Star-Ledger in one of your columns. Could you repeat this? Thank you in advance. – Ruthann, via e-mail

Ruthann, this is an old family recipe, and really is yummy. Place one 18-ounce box of dry chocolate cake mix in a large bowl, along with one 10-3/4-ounce can of UNDILUTED condensed tomato soup, 1 teaspoon of baking soda and two eggs, and NOTHING ELSE. Mix well, and bake according to the cake-mix directions. Frost with your favorite icing, or carefully pop some marshmallows on the top at the very end of baking. It's like marshmallow cream! 'EGG-ZACTLY'-RIGHT HINTS

Dear Heloise: A reader mentioned putting a 'smile" on hard-cooked eggs to tell them apart from raw ones.

Since my husband and I are now seniors, we use fewer eggs. When I buy a carton of eggs, I remove the date from the carton and tuck it in with the raw eggs, or I write, in pencil, the date on the top of each egg. Then I can tell how long I have had it. If I hard-cook eggs, I change the date to the date the eggs were boiled, and I add an X or put "hard cooked." - J.D., via e-mail

Speaking of easy egg ID, here's another hint, from Linda in Ohio. She says: "After Easter is over, egg-coloring kits are on sale for half-price or less. I purchase several and keep the dye tablets handy. Whenever I boil eggs during the year, I dissolve a dye tablet in a little vinegar and pour it into the water when they are almost done. Rinse the eggs as usual. The family never gets confused about whether they are picking up a hard-cooked egg or a raw one! And if there are stickers or other items in the box, I give them to our elementary school." - Heloise


CHEESE STORAGE

Dear Heloise: With the high price of cheese, there is a way to avoid mold for long periods of BWNDU IBJTPZ B ANPUBHD time. When I buy block cheese, I bring it home and immediately cut it up into smaller pieces. Then I double-wrap the smaller pieces in paper S N A T D W N Z U B D U , towels so that the moisture buildup is quickly wicked away from the cheese. I place it into resealable plastic bags, taking out as much air as possible before sealing.

Every time the cheese is taken out, I simply put on new paper-towel wraps and put it back into the same plastic sandwich bag. - John Encinio,

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Bridge • Steve Becker



Alert Defense It is a bridge fact of life that a defender can

never afford to relax. The nature of the game is such that it demands continuous concentration on the matters at hand.

Take this case where an inattentive West might easily allow declarer to sneak home at three notrump. However, the actual West was fully alert at the critical moment and delivered two successive blows that sank the contract. West started by leading a low spade. Declarer 20

could have made the contract then and there by putting up the king, but he instead made the more normal play of following low from dummy. East 2 won with the queen and returned the nine of clubs to dummy's queen.

Declarer crossed to his hand with the queen of diamonds and led the nine of spades toward dummy. The moment of truth for West was now at hand.

West had paid careful attention to this point and had come to several conclusions. First, he knew from East's play of the queen of spades at trick one that declarer had the jack. Second, he knew from East's "top-of-nothing" return of the club nine that declarer had the A-J-10 of that suit.

This in turn meant that if West followed low to the spade lead, or covered the nine with the ten, declarer would score nine tricks - four diamonds, four clubs and a spade. So West put up the ace at trick four, but his task was not yet complete. The next problem was to find a way to score

three more tricks before South could regain the lead. This was possible only if East had at least the A-Q-x of hearts. But if West shifted to a low heart, declarer could simply play low from dummy to force East to win and thereby assure the contract.

So West made the highly unusual return of the jack of hearts, and declarer was undone. In practice he played low, and East scored the next two tricks with the A-Q for down one.


