could become problematic if state tax revenue is lower than projections again.

Harrison said she's been told to keep as much money as possible in the district's contingency reserve fund in case the state is late with payments again. The state delayed several funding payments last year and districts had to cover their expenses out of the reserve.

"When we close out the year we hope we've saved enough to put money back in," she said.

No new funding was approved for staff training, national board certification or capital outlay. Capital outlay funds pay for buildings' routine maintenance and some equipment purchases and

the district will still have to raise money for those funds itself. Harrison said the district administration is still working on their five-year maintenance plan, which will tell them how much capital outlay money they'll need.

The district will also have to factor in the annual decrease in enrollment. Business Manager Jo DeYoung said, because of population trends, the district always budgets for a 4 percent decrease. This year's actual decrease was about 1 percent. DeYoung said they always use 4 percent because enrollment numbers change every year.

The legislature did approve bill that allows districts to keep school buses for 25 years, rather than 20. Harrison said the district would

still have to replace any bus that breaks down beyond repair.

Harrison said she has been impressed with the district's teachers and staff and hopes not to have to make any more cuts.

"We're probably cut to bare bones with staff," she said. "We're trying to hold on to everything we can."

The only other option, she said, would be to start cutting programs. Harrison said she hopes not to have to cut activities like music and art. Those two activities plus extra curricular clubs keep a lot of kids happy and involved, she said.

"They are the reason some of them stay in school," she said.

easy it is for teachers to archive their lessons. Teachers can record lectures and post them online for students who were absent.

"We don't have to only go to the institution to learn today," he said.

Fryer recommended breaking lectures into small chunks to help keep students attention.

This is the third year of the conference. Morgan said she has been involved each year and has enjoyed seeing new things added.

"It's nice to see it evolve to meet the teachers' needs," she said.

Fryer also spoke about how

projects such as iPods, pod casting, teaching without textbooks and archiving lectures electronically.

Wesley Fryer, who delivered the keynote address, held sessions on Internet publishing. Fryer spoke about getting students to be what he called "digital witnesses," to use technology to tell stories and post those stories for others to read.

"If students create something and move beyond being students and become teachers, than their retention rate will probably go up," he said.

Deadline to file for office coming up

Topeka, KS - Kansas Secretary of State Chris Biggs reminds Kansans that Democratic and Republican candidates who wish to appear on the primary ballot on Tuesday, Aug. 3, must file for office by noon on Thursday, June 10.

Biggs said, "I encourage all Kansans who are interested in serving their communities to 'throw their hat in the ring' and file for office."

In 2010, individuals will be elected or retained for the following offices:

One U.S. senator, all four U.S. representatives, governor and lieutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general, state treasurer, commissioner of insurance, all 125 state representatives, state board of education (districts 1, 3, 5, 7, 9), district magistrate judges (16 retained, 2 elected), four

Kansas Supreme Court justices (districts 1, 2, 3, 5), eight Kansas Court of Appeals judges, and district court judges (40 retained, 29 elected).

In order to file for office, individuals must complete the necessary paperwork and submit a fee or petition. Candidates for national or state office file with the Secretary of State's Office, while candidates for local office file with their county election office.

Trego juvenile jail facility to shut down next Friday

WAKEENEY (AP) - Trego County officials are looking for someone to operate a county-owned juvenile detention center in western Kansas.

The Hays Daily News reported that the Greater Western Kansas Regional Juvenile Detention Center in WaKeeney is scheduled to close next Friday, June 11, costing the region 29 jobs.

The Lenexa-based Clarence M. Kelley Juvenile Justice Resources group, which operated the facil-

ity, said it was losing \$12,000 to \$18,000 a month at the center.

The facility is capable of housing 28 juveniles. But its census had been much smaller.

The Trego County Commission was scheduled to meet today with representatives of Associated Youth Services, which has expressed interest in operating the facility. The organization already provides services for the Juvenile Justice Authority in Kansas.

Keep political signs off state right of way

It's a sign of the season - campaigning to support your favorite political candidate. However, if your plans involve placing a political sign, the Kansas Department of Transportation reminds you to make sure it's not located on a highway right of way.

By law, all right of way on state highways is to be used exclusively for public highway purposes. Only regulatory, guide signs and warning signs are allowed on the state highway system. The department has jurisdiction over all interstate, Kansas and U.S. routes on the state's 9,600-mile system.

The public should be aware that all political campaign signs or billboards are prohibited on the state right of way.

When department maintenance crews find political or business advertising on state right of way, the signs will be removed immediately without notice. All such signs will then be taken to the closest subarea office where they can be picked up by the owner with the agreement they will not be placed on state right of way again. All political campaign signs not picked up will be disposed of after the election.

Political campaign advertising is allowed on private property bordering state right of way. However, people erecting signs

on private property must first obtain permission from the property owner.
