Rexford siren fails, county weighs fixes

"There isn't any other way we can do it," said Chairman Ken Christiansen, "because we're in the season, and if the grant fails, replacing three sirens could cost as much as \$55,000."
 He said he recalled a time in the past three or four years, when Jim Engle was emergency preparedness director, there was a plan that four sirens with a broader range could cover the city of Colby, and if that plan would still work, they might consider giving Rexford one of the current Colby sirens.
 They tabled any further action until they hear back from McMan about the grant.
 Department heads crowded the commissioners' meeting room when it was time for the discussion with Charlie Krull, representative from Blue Cross and Blue Shield for the county's employees health coverage. All departments said they were satisfied with the same \$500 deductible as in the past.
 He said that utilization drives the premiums and that like most counties and organizations, 50 percent of the utilization went to three percent of the group being covered.
 "Utilization is what drives premiums," Krull said, "and we ex-

pect the wellness benefits to kick in next year."
 Commissioner Paul Steele said that county employees worried about raises need to consider that the county is spending \$73,000 more this year in health insurance because premiums had taken a 34 percent jump over last year.
 In other business:
 • Peggy Pratt, from Juvenile Services in WaKeeney, was at the Monday meeting with a request to be in the 2011 county budget. She said her request was the same as last year's \$1,000 allowance.
 She told the commissioners the re-opening of the juvenile facility at WaKeeney would take a while, because new operators would have to have new licenses, but she felt very good about the choice of operators because they have been in business since 1912 and have a good reputation.
 • The commissioners heard from Bob McLemore, Colby fire chief, who brought a contract between the city and county that covers rescue and hazardous materials coverage for three years. There was no change in the contract amount of \$20,000 a year for the next three years. The commissioners approved the contract.
 • The commissioners will meet again next Monday at 9 a.m. in the courthouse.
