Vesta Roth will celebrate her 80th birthday with an open house from 1 to 3 p.m. Sunday at the Red Barn in Rexford.

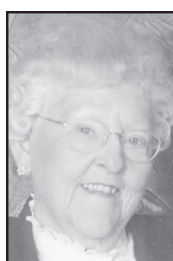
Her children, Dan (Janice) Roth of Abilene and Rick Roth of Stockton, invite family and friends to attend.



