Wheat plot tour coming next week

The Thomas County Extension Council will be holding their annual Wheat Plot tour at 7:30 a.m. Tuesday at Mike Brown's farm 4.5 miles south of the Levant exit on I-70, in the shop on the east side of the road. Erick DeWolf, Extension plant pathologist, Brian Olson, Extension agronomist, and Dan O'Brien, Extension economist will be speakers. Before the tour there will be discussions of stripe rust, barley yellow dwarf, identifying diseases, and wheat marketing issues. Included in the plot tour will be varieties and their stress levels caused by stripe and/or leaf rust, as the plot was not sprayed with a fungicide. DeWolf and Olson will point out any signs of insect, disease, or weather damage to help improve crop scouting skills. Mattson Farms is providing donuts and Kansas Wheat is sponsoring the beverages.
