Take safety precautions with bulls

MANHATTAN - As breeding season rolls around, and repair their working facilities, noting that the Kansas State University's Chris Reinhardt wants to same facilities that handled last season's calves remind stockmen to take extra care when working with cattle, especially bulls.

"Hand-raised bulls do not have the same timidity around humans as those raised by their dam," said Reinhardt, a feedlot specialist with K-State Research and Extension. "These bulls view humans as their equal and always have the potential to become aggressive toward their handler."

He encourages people to take the time to inspect

He encourages stockmen to take their own age into account when working with mature cattle.
