WICHITA – The winter wheat harvested by Kansas farmers has been "above average" in quality and quantity, easing early fears sparked by low protein in winter wheat cut in Texas and Oklahoma.

Wheat must be at least 12 percent protein to be good for bread, said Justin Gilpin, chief executive officer for the industry trade group Kansas Wheat. That's also the preferred amount for wheat sold to customers such as Nigeria, Mexico and Japan.

Rough seas pushing oil slick onto Gulf beaches

GRAND ISLE - Rough seas generated by Hurricane Alex come to the beach for the July pushed more oil from the massive spill onto Gulf Coast beaches Wednesday as cleanup vessels were sidelined by the faraway storm's ripple effects.

The hurricane was churning coastal waters across the oilaffected region on the Gulf of Mexico. Six-foot waves and 25 mph winds were forecast through Thursday just offshore from the the Florida Panhandle.

In Louisiana, the storm pushed an oil patch toward Grand Isle and uninhabited Elmer's Island, dumping tar balls as big as apples on the beach.
