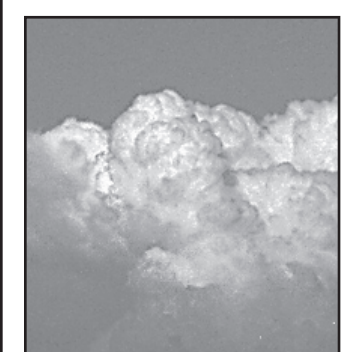


Weather Corner

Colby author releases new book

dards."
 "All Stubborned Up" is set in northwest Kansas in 2000-2001, she said, but she created a fictitious town and county. The book is about the good and the bad and has a touch of suspense and a villain, she said. Plus, John added, the ending will satisfy the reader.
 "The book is not about me, or my family, or anyone I know," Sanders said, "but ... the title is me."
 She said the title came from her brother's observation of this sister of his when he asked her to do something for him, and he said that she "got all stubborned up."
 "The publisher wanted me to change the title," she chuckled, "but I got all stubborned up and didn't change it."
 The book is being self-published, which is common today in a world dominated by few big publishers.
 "We are so thankful we have the self-publishers," she said, "because only a few writers can even get agents to help them find a big publisher. And while there are many self-publishers out there, we have found a good one."
 "The people at our Internet-based publisher, iUniverse, are great to work with. They have high standards and asked us to aim for one of the highest, the Chicago Manual of Style, wanting our manuscript to be letter perfect with it, and we hope we are there."
 She said iUniverse gave her book an "editor's choice" designation for doing as well as she had, and she did even more to make it as perfect as possible.
 "Quilters always make one mistake," she chuckled, "because even God doesn't expect you to be perfectly perfect."
 Sanders, 71, said her writing background includes writing for and co-editing *Current*, the student literary magazine at Kansas Wesleyan University in Salina, where she completed her Bachelor of Arts; studying creative writing at Kansas State University; and being published in K-State's campus student literary magazine *Touchstone*, which she co-edited one semester with fellow student Mike Hayden long before he was governor of Kansas.
 After her work at K-State, she

said, she taught composition at Pittsburg State University. She then went to the University of Kansas to get a Bachelor of Science in English and a remedial reading certification, but she didn't have time to write while she was at KU.
 She came to Colby to teach middle-school English and remedial reading. Her interest in students' learning problems led her to continue her studies while teaching and earning a Master of Science degree in learning disabilities from Fort Hays State University.
 She taught middle school and high school students with learning disabilities, plus other special education students, and wrote curriculum materials for them, completing her career in the new Colby High School building.
 She retired to devote full time to writing in 1996, and since has churned out six books. Five of them - the ones she is waiting to proofread - are about the 1930s in northwest Kansas.
 Sanders said her son, J. Shad Sanders, did the cover art for "All Stubborned Up." She was pleased, too, she added, to have had a 16-year-old granddaughter Kayla Sale to help proof and another granddaughter, Katie Jo Sale 11, who is a serious writer.
 "Most of all," she said, "I'm honored to have my picky, picky editor husband to weed out the mistakes."
 She said she feels fortunate to have studied under Ron Hansen, a serious historical fiction writer and author of "Hitler's Niece" and other books. He's the one who suggested more emphasis on the role of the villain in the book, she added.
 Although Sanders was born and raised in Rawlins County, she attended Colby schools, graduating in 1957. A highlight for her this year, she said, was the Colby Alumni Reunion last week, when her former classmates all bought a book, which she was able to sign for them.
 On the cover of Sanders' novel is the comment, "Nancy Sanders knows Kansas and its people, and her writing is intelligent and from the heart," from Kent Nelson, author of "Land that Moves, Land that's Still" and "The Touching that Lasts."

Candidates spar over immigration

dates sparred on other issues, including how to handle suspected terrorists. Tiaht, citing House votes in 2006, said Moran favored giving suspected terrorists constitutional rights, but Moran said after the debate that's not true.
 The debate was broadcast live from the studios of KSNT, the NBC affiliate in Topeka.
 The two candidates' back-and-forth on immigration came the same day the Obama administration sued Arizona, hoping to block its tough new law against illegal immigration. Both Tiaht and Moran also are running to the right in their Aug. 3 primary contest and wooing tea party adherents.
 Tiaht said he not only wants to complete the border fence but wants to stop printing bilingual election ballots, a practice he said encourages people to come to the U.S. illegally. Moran endorsed the new Arizona law - directing local police to check people's immigration status - and derided the Obama administration's challenge as "a silly waste of taxpayer dollars."
 But amid that tough talk, Tiaht acknowledged he once supported proposals on tuition and driver's

licenses; Moran's staff noted Tiaht co-sponsored legislation in 2001 and 2003. Supporters of such policies say they mostly help children who are brought to the U.S. by their parents and stay into young adulthood.
 "A long time ago, I thought it was compassionate to not punish the children for the parents' sins, but I've listened to the people of Kansas. I've studied this issue," Tiaht said. "I've come to the conclusion that we must build the fence, that we must say no to amnesty."
 Tiaht also said Moran opposed federal legislation to block cities from making themselves sanctuaries for illegal immigrants. Tiaht's staff cited Moran's vote against a proposal in 2003 to cut off federal funds to cities that wouldn't allow law enforcement to share information with the federal government.
 Moran said he doubts he'd have the endorsement of former GOP U.S. Rep. Tom Tancredo, of Colorado, a vocal supporter of the Arizona law and tougher federal policies, if he were soft on immigration.
 "I've voted numerous times in support of eliminating sanctuary cities," Moran said. "That's a terrible idea. It's wrong."
 Tiaht has represented the 4th

Congressional District of south-central Kansas since 1995, and Moran has held the seat for the 1st District of western and central Kansas since 1997. Two other candidates are on the ballot for the primary, Mound City accountant Tom Little and Overland Park attorney Robert Londerholm, who served as Kansas attorney general in 1965-69, but neither was in the debate.
 Five Democrats also are running for the Senate seat, now held by Sen. Sam Brownback, a conservative Republican who's running for governor.
 Tiaht criticized Moran on terrorism issues in a television ad his campaign began broadcasting statewide Tuesday, including in Topeka during the debate.
 "He has a weak record on national security, and I think that's why he supports constitutional rights for terrorists," Tiaht said.
 Tiaht's campaign cited two votes by Moran in 2006 against legislation to continue allowing military tribunals to try suspected terrorists, legislation Tiaht supported. Moran said after the debate that he'd viewed the legislation as flawed and unconstitutional.
 "Let me categorically say I do not support constitutional rights for terrorists," Moran said.
