It's that time of year when gar-times, insects will live on the undens are flourishing, but in addition to enjoying flowers and vegetables, gardeners should carefully inspect their plants each day.

sure that they look healthy," advised Kansas State University horticulturalist Rebecca McMahon. "When you're looking for insect problems, you'll want to get in close and look at the leaves. Remember to get down and look at the bottom of the plant, because insects may start near the bottom and work their way up."

McMahon encouraged gardeners to check both sides of the web at www.kansasgreenyards. leaves if they find holes. "Often- org.

dersides of the leaves, and you may not see them until it's too late," she said.

McMahon also said gardeners "Look the plants over to make should watch for eggs and frass, or insect excrement, on the underside of leaves. These can be signs of undesirable insect activity.

Not all insects are bad, though. Ladybug larvae like to feed on insects that are harmful to plants. Other plants are meant to attract certain insects, such as the swallowtail butterfly caterpillar, Mc-Mahon said.


