Huelskamp said many people ask him how the country can get back on track. "What you have to ask is: what do you have to stop first?" he said.

One of the first things he would get rid of is the president's health care legislation, he said. "We need to replace it with something that works," he said, "something that increases accessibility and affordability (of health care)."

The Democrats' bill doesn't help curb medical malpractice lawsuits, he said, which drive premiums doctors must pay even higher.

Another legislative effort Huelskamp said he would fight against is the so-called "cap and trade" plan, which seeks to limit industrial emissions of carbon dioxide and allow companies to trade their pollution allowances. Huelskamp said he was disappointed to find the Kansas state government on the other side,

supporting cap and trade, under the Democrats. Regulations like this, he said, have caused delays in essential projects like the Holcomb Power Station expansion project, which is still in hearings. "We'll need more energy when we lose our contracts with other power plants," he said.

Ostmeyer said he enjoys touring with Huelskamp in much the same way he enjoyed touring with U.S. Sen. Pat Roberts. Federal and state issues are often linked, he said, and it's good to have someone on hand who wants to speak about either level.

The latest polls have Huelskamp in second place for the primary, with Tracey Mann of Saline and Barnett tied for first. All three are within the margin of error, however, and most estimates are it's a three-man race.

Other candidates are Rob Wassinger of Cottonwood Falls, Sue Boldra of Hays and Marck Cobb of Galva. All have been to Colby several at least once.

have more spacing options and can get more signs out of each sheet of material. The machine will also make other signs, such as stop signs, that the county's current equipment can't make.

The county's current sign-making machine is no longer in production, he said, and while parts are still available, a new machine would be easier to service.

Commissioner Byron Sowers

asked him how the cost compared to buying the signs, and how many signs there were in the county. Schrock said it is much cheaper, and the county has thousands of signs.

The commissioners approved Schrock's request. He said Monday that he has applied for a \$2,000 grant through the county's insurance company. The machine qualifies because good road signs could cut the county's liability.

**Experimental cap holding back oil despite seepage**

NEW ORLEANS - The federal government agreed today to let BP to keep the cap shut tight on its ruptured Gulf of Mexico oil well for another day despite evidence of something seeping near the sea floor.

The Obama administration's point man for the spill, retired Coast Guard Adm. Thad Allen, said early this morning that the company promised to watch closely for signs of new leaks around the mile-deep well, which has stopped gushing oil into the water since the experimental cap was closed Thursday.

Late Sunday, Allen said something was detected seeping near the broken well and demanded in a sharply worded letter that BP step up monitoring of the ocean floor. Allen didn't say what was seeping. White House energy adviser Carol Browner told the CBS "Early Show" seepage was found less than two miles from the well site.

The concern all along - since pressure readings on the cap weren't as high as expected - was a leak elsewhere in the well bore was letting oil out, meaning the cap may have to be reopened to

prevent the environmental disaster from becoming even harder to fix. An underground leak could let oil and gas escape uncontrolled through bedrock and mud.

"When seeps are detected," Allen said in a letter to BP Managing Director Bob Dudley, "you are directed to marshal resources, quickly investigate, and report findings to the government in no more than four hours. I direct you to provide me a written procedure for opening the choke valve as quickly as possible without damaging the well should hydrocarbon seepage near the well head be confirmed."

When asked about the seepage and the monitoring, BP spokesman Mark Salt would only say that "we continue to work very closely with all government scientists on this."

Allen said BP could continue testing the cap, meaning keeping it shut, only if the company continues to meet its obligations to rigorously monitor for any signs that this test could worsen the situation.

Browner said Allen's extension went until this afternoon. "Clearly we want this to end. But we don't want to enter into a situation where we have uncontrolled leaks all over the Gulf floor," Browner said on ABC's

"Good Morning America" BP said today that the cost of dealing with the oil spill has now reached nearly \$4 billion. The company said it has made payments totaling \$207 million to settle individual claims for damages from the spill along the southern coast. Almost 116,000 claims have been submitted and more than 67,500 payments have been made, totaling \$207 million.

With the newly installed cap

keeping oil from BP's fractured well out of the Gulf during a trial run, this weekend offered a chance for the company and government to gloat over their shared success - the first real victory in fighting the spill. Instead, the two sides have spent the past two days disagreeing over what to with the undersea machinery holding back the gusher.

The apparent disagreement began to sprout Saturday when Al-

len said the cap would eventually be hooked up to a mile-long pipe to pump the crude to ships on the surface. But early the next day, BP chief operating officer Doug Suttles said the cap should stay clamped shut to keep in the oil until a permanent fix is done, maybe next week.

If the valves are kept closed, as BP wants, it's possible that no more oil will leak into the Gulf of Mexico.
