Documentary on woodpecker slated for Sternberg in October

"Ghost Bird," a documentary about the search for elusive ivory-billed woodpecker, will be shown at 7 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 14, at the Sternberg Museum of Natural History in Hays.

Several sightings and a video shot in 2005 by a University of Arkansas Professor David Luneau gave ornithologists hope that the bird, believed to be extinct since the 1940s, might still exist. The woodpecker, about 20 inches long with a 30-inch wingspan, was the largest in North America. No one since has found an ivory-billed woodpecker in the swamps of Arkansas, and much debate has developed over the evidence.

"Ghost Bird" explores the de-

bate and different angles of the story, focusing on whether spotters really saw the woodpecker, people's role in conserving our natural resources, and how natural resources can be used in ecotourism to help small towns.

The possibility that the species still exists not only has sparked efforts to conserve the bird but has also created an economic boom for Brinkley, Ark., said Curtis Wolf, director of the Wetlands Education Center.
