**Candidate talks immigration**

ican candidate's web site says he "opposes any amnesty and supports enforcing existing laws."

Sending all illegal immigrants back would have a destabilizing effect on Mexico, he said, and would only increase the number of people who want to get across the border. Simply deporting all illegal immigrants wouldn't be good for the U.S. either, he said, since with the large number of retiring U.S. citizens, we would have a labor shortage. Kansas, particularly the southwestern part of the state, would take a big hit from that kind of workforce depletion, he said.

Jilka said he had recently visited the border states, going to El Paso, Texas, Juarez, Mexico, Tucson, Ariz., and Nogales, Ariz. He spoke with mayors and congressmen about the situation on the border.

"I wanted to learn more," he said. "It confirmed some preconceived notions and overturned others."

One of those notions, he said, was the impression that the drug violence in Mexico is spilling over the border. But according to the mayor of El Paso, there has been only one murder in that city, population 620,000, in the past three years compared to 5,000 in Juarez during the same period. Jilka said there has not been a murder in the border town of Nogales in three years.

On the other hand, Jilka said, the "Tucson Section" of the U.S.-Mexico border - between Yuma County, Ariz., and New Mexico - is a hotbed of drug smug-

gling. Half of all drug seizures on the border take place in this region, he said, and Arizona legislators have been pushing for more Border Patrol agents, unmanned surveillance drones and better cell-phone coverage.

Jilka said he favors tightening border security while ensuring that commerce still flows. As much as \$53 billion per year in trade crosses the boarder between Juarez and El Paso alone, he said damaging that kind of legitimate trade would hurt both countries. One thing that can be done is to modernize the bridge crossings in El Paso, he said. The bridges date from the 1970s, and updating them would allow legitimate commerce to proceed while curtailing illegal crossings.

Jilka said he favors an "earned citizenship program," where people already living in the country could get citizenship, but would require them to learn English, pay a fine and back taxes and pass a criminal background check.

He said he would also like to reform the existing legal immigration system. The current system favors educated people like engineers or doctors. Any immigration reform should allow for more legal immigration of less skilled laborers, he said.

Jilka said the U.S. has made significant efforts to improve border security, pointing to the \$600 million border security bill just signed into law. The new law will pay for 1,500 more border agents and more aerial drone coverage.

**Moderates to play big role in election**

"I expect that many moderate Republicans will not be able to support Kobach," said former Kansas Senate President Dick Bond, an Overland Park moderate. "He seems to have gone farther and farther to the right."

Kobach remains confident that he'll win. He said after the unity breakfast that critics call him an extremist to avoid talking about specific policies he proposes.

He hopes to unseat Secretary of State Chris Biggs in the Nov. 2 general election. Biggs was appointed in March by Gov. Mark Parkinson, a fellow Democrat, after four-term Republican Ron Thornburgh resigned to take a private-sector job.

Kobach received 51 percent of the vote in the GOP primary against Shawnee County Election Commissioner Elizabeth Ensley and J.R. Claeys, a former chief executive officer for the National Association of Government Contractors.

Kobach emphasizes voter fraud as an issue, linking it to immigration by suggesting state laws are lax enough to allow illegal immigrants to register to vote.

He wants to require voters to show a photo ID at the polls and to provide proof of citizenship, such as a birth certificate, when they register for the first time.

Biggs opposes those measures, arguing they'll suppress voter turnout and represent an overreaction to the relative handful of voter fraud cases over the past two decades. He said the real problem with voter fraud is that cases are rare enough in Kansas that county officials don't know how to handle them when they crop up.

As for Kobach, Biggs said, "In a lot of ways, he has expressed that he has total command of imaginary issues."

Yet voter ID proposals have widespread support among Republican legislators, who pushed bills to passage in 2003 and 2008, only to see them vetoed by then-Democratic Gov. Kathleen Sebelius.

"It is not an issue that divides moderate Republicans and conservative Republicans," Kobach said. "We are 100 percent together on that."

Kobach's prominence on immigration issues and uncertainty about how many GOP moderates will defect to Biggs make the sec-

retary of state's race perhaps the most interesting political contest in Kansas this fall.

have been with the Teen Challenge program for three years. When they were looking for a location and were ready to step out on their own, she said, a look at the map showed there was no Teen Challenge program or facility for girls between Salt Lake City and Kansas City.

"We knew where we should be," said Vicky, "a place that was removed from the city life, where values were good."

She said the program is based in faith, offering spiritual guidance, accredited alternative education for high school graduation, and is structured and loving, with positive reinforcement.

Victory House serves nutritious meals and snacks and the girls get training in social skills and healthy social outlets. The days include prayer, counseling and restorative ministries for both the girls and their families, Taff said.

"Many times it is the parents who call us," she said, "looking

for a network of faith partners to their daughters when they are in a rebellious stage, on drugs, have emotional issues, and are making poor choices in friendships, or are even suicidal.

"These things just creep into young people's lives, and we are there to help them become emotionally balanced and socially adjusted and spiritually alive."

She said they believe that being able to help someone's daughter is too priceless a ministry to place it out of financial reach. They are willing to adjust charges, regardless of financial status, to get a girl the help she needs.

She said the only question is, "Can you afford not to call for help?"
