Lady Trojans' coach confident about squad

The Colby Community College volleyball team has a new look for the 2010 season, with 11 new players, a new assistant coach in Natalia Tomaszewska and, coaches say, a new attitude.

Second-year head coach Carey Jones brought in her first recruiting class for the Trojans, and she's confident her team will be more consistent and competitive than last season. Jones said she focused on improving the team by recruiting players that fit her style and who would mesh together on and off the

One of the focuses in recruiting for Jones was getting taller and more athletic in the hitter positions. Among the 11 newcomers are six players who stand 5-foot-9 or better.

"This is the first recruiting class I've brought in as a college coach," Jones said. "I'm confident in my ability to recruit, confident in the players I've brought in, and look forward to building a successful program here at Colby.'

The Lady Trojans have five returning sophomores whom Jones expects to take leadership roles and set good examples for the newcomers.

"The girls are holding each other accountable, and our sophomores have been vocal over the first few weeks of practice," Jones said. "We've had a different atmosphere at practice, and our attitude has been positive.'

Jones is optimistic about her team's chances this season, but said it's still too early to gauge exactly what her team is capable of.

"We're optimistic we can be in the top of the conference," Jones said. "Our goal is always to challenge to win the conference, and we'll always work toward that. We still need to work and improve in many areas in order to accomplish our goals. Our passing needs to be solid, and our setters need to be

The conference has also seen a lot of change from last season. Cloud County moved up to Division I, giving the Jayhawk West Division eight teams. Hutchinson, Cloud County and Garden City also have first-year head coaches, and almost every team is going to be reliant on freshmen to contribute.

'Our conference is always tough, and we need to develop the confidence that we can play with and beat anyone," said Jones. "Natalia and I both feel our team is capable of competing with anyone."

Returners

The Lady Trojans return five sophomores, including three starters, from last season. Emily Lubbers, a sophomore setter from Yuma, Colo., and Jordyn White, a sophomore libero from Brighton, Colo., are the team captains. Jones said both players will see "significant" playing time, and will factor heavily on the team's success.

Kadee Arensdorf from Maywood, Neb., will return, but she's been sidelined by a knee injury for the past six weeks. Jones said Arensdorf will be counted on to contribute once she is healthy and back in shape. The other returning player is Tess Robben, a 5-foot-6 middle blocker from Sharon Springs. Jones said Robben plays an important role for the Lady Trojans with her work ethic and she makes her teammates better.

Newcomers

Sophomore transfer Danqi Li from China joins the team after playing her freshman season at Iowa Lakes Community College. Li saw limited time last season playing for Iowa Lakes - a team that qualified for the national tournament - but will be counted on in the middle this season. Jones said Li will improve the Lady Trojans' middle with her attacking and blocking ability.

Nichelle Erskine, a freshman from Brewster High School, headlines the freshman class. Assistant Coach Natalia Tomaszewska said Nichelle has wellrounded skills and the capability to play several po-

"Nichelle's versatility of being able to play in the middle or hit from the outside will make a difference for this team," Tomaszewska said.

Other newcomers looking to make an impact at

the hitter positions include Ashley McMullen from Burwell, Neb.; Nora Roth, Holyoke, Colo.; Vanessa Loya, El Paso, Texas; Kamee Benisch, Sharon Springs, and Ana Calito, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. McMullen, the first recruit signed by Jones, is

making the transition from outside to middle hitter. Jones said that McMullen is a quick, aggressive hitter who has adjusted well to her new position, and will continue to improve with practice.

Roth and Loya will compete for playing time as right-side hitter with Erskine. Jones describes Roth as a strong blocker and a big presence on the court. Loya, also a strong blocker, is adapting to college play, said Jones.

Benisch and Calito will compete for time at the outside hitter position. Jones said both are adapting to college play and continue to improve every day in practice. Benisch is a good blocker and Calito, despite being undersized at 5-foot-8, places the ball well when attacking.

Jennie Watkins, a freshman from Houston, will compete with Jordyn White for playing time at libero. Jones said Watkins is consistent with her passing and has experience playing against high-level com-

"Jennie has a quiet confidence about her. We know if we put her out there, she'll be competitive and get the job done." Jones said.
