Peach said a barbecue will begin the night. She said cancer survivors can eat for free, but caregivers and others have to pay. Participants will meet by a stage set up in the park at 7 p.m. Then survivors will take a lap around the park to start the relay.

Peach said the survivors will start walking the first lap alone and the caregivers will join them before they finish. For the rest of the night, at least one person from each team will be on the sidewalk. The event ends at 7 a.m.

Peach said people can still buy luminaries, which they can decorate in honor of loved ones who died of

cancer or are currently living with cancer. Peach said the luminaries are made to look like paper sandwich bags. Each one has a Relay for Life symbol on it, with sand inside to weigh it down.

The luminaries will line the sidewalk around the park, Peach said. About 9 p.m., candles inside the luminaries will be lit and the names of all the people being honored will be called out. Once that session is over, participants will be able to play games when they are not walking laps, Peach said.

Luminaries cost \$10 each before that night, or you can buy them at the event.

A band will be playing throughout the night, Peach said.

said, "and the days were really busy. We were up at 5 and at 5:30 a.m., then went to the field where we had physical training exercises for an hour and a half before breakfast.

"There was a huge mess hall where all officers and midshipmen eat at the same time. There was one whole building that was the kitchen, and there were around 5,000 midshipmen and officers."

He said he got to experience a cruise on a patrol boat in the harbor, and it was really impressive.

"It's all tradition up there," he said. "You can't even go through the main door unless you are an officer. It's crazy, tradition is so strong."

"It's (senior midshipmen's) job

to treat everyone who is a pleb (freshman) like dirt, and man you don't rate at all. You can't even put your head up when you're eating and have to look down at the plate. You have to learn to recite what the next three meals are, down to all of the side dishes. But they don't single anyone out. They treated us all like we were dirt, just dirt!"

Kendrick said the Naval Academy has everything to offer in a way of an education, and if he gets to go there, he'll get to pursue his goal of nuclear engineer, eventually becoming captain of a nuclear subs and train for nuclear surface warfare.

The possibilities really are unlimited, he said, and if he qualifies there are huge scholarships for the first four years. If he gets accepted

into the "nuke" program, he added, he would get two years of free nuclear engineering school.

Kendrick said he really wants to be accepted and is working hard on the appointment. Right now, he said, it's just a matter of a couple of more contacts, and an essay and then he's nearly ready.

He said his dad, a KBI agent stationed in Colby, pushed the idea for two years, and all the while, he hated it, but the more he checked into the academy, the better it looked.

"Now, I guess if I don't make it, I guess I'll go to Colorado School of Mines for nuclear or biological engineering," he said, "but if I don't get nominated to the Naval Academy, I can reapply."

Sealing project begins

Heft and Sons of Greensburg was to begin a sealing project today on U.S. 83 in Logan and Thomas counties.

The road will be sealed from U.S. 40 just west of Oakley north about 19 miles to U.S. 24.

The seal fills surface cracks that can shorten pavement life, said Roy Meier, area construction manager for the Kansas Department of Transportation in Oakley. Workers will spread a thin layer of asphalt over the pavement, then coat it with a layer of rock chips that is pressed into place with heavy rollers.

During daylight hours, traffic will be reduced to one lane through the work zone and guided by a pilot car. Travelers should plan delays of up to 15 minutes, and watch for work zone warning signs and workers.

The job should be done by Tuesday, Meier said. The estimated cost is \$508,474.

Judge says nonresidents can work petitions here

badly or had any bad intent when they passed it," Treuden said. "It is just that they violated the Constitution when they did it - whether that be innocently or not."

The Constitution Party is not a recognized political party in Kansas, but is considered by the state to be a political action committee. The only four recognized party affiliations in Kansas are Democratic, Republican, Libertarian and Reform.

Among the issues raised in the lawsuit was the state requirement baring nonresidents from circulating ballot recognition petitions within the state. Pickens argued that the statute not only violated the First and Fourteenth Amendment rights protecting free speech and association but also violated the federal commerce clause in limiting interstate commerce by banning out-of-state residents from working as paid petition circulators in Kansas.

The Kansas attorney general's office referred any comment to the secretary of state's office. Abbie Hodgson, a spokeswoman for the secretary of state's office, said her office will not enforce the statute and plans to approach the Legislature next session about amending it to remove the in-state residency requirement.

Engelbrecht did not immediately respond to messages seeking comment.

The order entered Friday addresses only the part of the lawsuit dealing with the residency requirement for circulating petitions in Kansas.

In the lawsuit, the Constitution Party of Kansas also contends that since it is not recognized by the state, its supporters and members cannot proclaim their affiliation with it when registering to vote and the group is not provided voter registration information given to other political parties. The lawsuit claims that violates their rights to association and equal protection.
