The law allows officers to stop vehicles solely for seat-belt violations. Previously, seat-belt scofflaws could be cited only if they charging what you want," said were stopped for some other offense, such as speeding.

In passing the law, the Legislature reduced the fine for adult drivers from \$30 to \$5 until mid-2011, when it goes to \$10. And that includes court costs.
