If you need inspiration, read the children's book "A Beginning, a son of Light: A Holiday Collection

Way to Write Writing." by Avi and Tricia Tusa. Avi is a renowned author of children's and junior/ young adult books.

I tout this author because it is often harder to write a young person's book than one for adults. The younger the audience, the more concise the discussion and the more creative a person needs to be.

Our library has added a few free verse poetry books. The first is "The Years and Beyond: Inspirational Poetry," by William Furr. It starts with a tribute to the heroes that fought and died. It also talks of our country, the land, life's journeys and most notably a lengthy poem called "God is."

Two other poetry and essay books are from the Kansas City Writers' Group - "Beginning From the Middle" and "The Sea-

"The Season of Light" is stories and poetry about Christmas and winter. I loved the poem "In Winter." Everyone that teaches English grammar will be warmed with the use of terms in this work. "Christmas at the Grain Elevator" looks good, and "Gabriel's Annunciation Briefing."

Another book – not poetry but part of the American Poets Project – is "Stephen Foster and Co.: Lyrics of the First Great American Songwriters," by Stephen Foster and Ken Emerson. This book has plantation melodies, parlor ballads, songs of protest and poverty, drinking and temperance songs, war songs, and comic songs.


