We are adding many youth and junior books to the library. *Pretty Little Liars* is a series by Sara Shepard in four volumes: "Pretty Little Liars," "Flawless," "Perfect," and "Unbelievable." In "Pretty Little Liars," Aria, and Emily, Hanna, and Spencer have secrets no one knows about until their friend Alison DiLaurentis suddenly disappears. These Pennsylvania high school juniors now are faced with a dilemma. Their secrets have to come out because they must deal with the menacing notes they have begun to receive. "Flawless" also deals with secrets and divulging the ladies' lives. But IM is going to use texting and other hateful means to destroy their lives. Find out how these young ladies solve their problems.

We will also be adding three items from Elizabeth Chandler; "Dark Secrets 1: Legacy of Lies and Don't Tell," "Dark Secrets 2: No Time to Die and the Deep End of Fear," and "Kissed by an Angel." "Legacy of Lies" is two novellas set in the town of Wisteria. Megan, in "Legacy of Lies," must visit her grandmother against her desires. She makes the most of a

crummy situation and meets her cousin who proceeds to tell her the family's dark secrets. Now she must discover the truth and reclaim her equilibrium through the process.

Novella number 2 is "Don't Tell." Seven years ago, protagonist Lauren lost her mother to a drowning accident. She is now returning to the family environment where the death happened. Now much older, Lauren is confronted with her godmother's daughters Holly and Nora, also reconnecting with Nick, a childhood friend. Lauren finds that the facts are not what she thought they were and comes to believe that she herself might also be in danger.

"Dark Secrets 2" also has two novellas introducing two more ladies into the series. Chandler is probably setting up these four characters to continue to deal with issues in other volumes. "Kissed by an Angel" has young woman Ivy devastated to lose Tristan, her boyfriend and confidant. Ivy thought that angels were supposed to help keep these things from happening. In her sorrow she discovers that angels do, in fact, help others. The angel who begins to help her is intimately familiar to her, but has a problem. The angel is on a mission that has an end. These two, Ivy and the angel must work through this situation.

We are also adding "The Lost Hero," by Rick Riordan. This is the first book in a new series set in the same world of Percy Jackson and the *Olympian* books series.

Three new characters – Jason, who has amnesia, Piper, who is gifted in persuasion, and Leo, an attention deficit disorder youth who is very smart and imaginative in his thinking, find themselves in a battle with demi-gods and needing to find Percy Jackson to boot.

Another new book is "Halo," by Alexandra Adornetto, who wrote the book about angels Bethany Church and Gabriel when she was 17 years old. They are involved with others in a high school environment fighting evil. This new book is expected to begin a series much like "Twilight." It is the next hot item to read for many teens.

Another book is "Behemoth," by Scott Westerfeld, book two in the *Leviathan* trilogy. Alek, an Austrian Clanker and Deryn an English Darwinist are in fact rivals when they begin. Circumstances lead them to an alliance to defeat the sultan of Istanbul. This book is based on historical information from World War I. Churchill's relationship with the Ottoman Empire and the Archduke of Ferdinand's demise.

A new book in the adult biography section is "Zero Regrets: Be Greater Than Yesterday," by Apolo Ohno (the Olympian speed skater champion). I think youth will love this book as well as adults.

We are adding many more books to the youth and junior section of the library; come and check out the new books section and discover many new treasures. Soon to come are Erin Hunter's *Warrior Series* and the *Prophecy Series*. Get your name on the hold or reserve list to read them.
