calculators for the math department for academics, football for athletics and forensics for activities."
 Tubbs said the average time spent for the test drive and questionnaire should be about 15 minutes, and they need at least 300 test drives during the allotted time period to reach the \$6,000 figure. The rules limit families to one test drive per address, she noted.
 And it gets even better: the school has a chance to be chosen for a double prize. Audra Fleming, a senior who makes promo films for the Colby High School debate team, will be filming that day. If her film is picked from about 50 entries, Ford Motor Co. will double the prize, boosting the amount to \$12,000, Tubbs said.
 And that's not all. The Midwest Ford Dealers Advertising Association will add another \$6,000 if there are lots and lots of "hits" on Facebook regarding the event.
 "So basically, there is an opportunity to add \$18,000 to programs in the Colby School," Tubbs said. "There is already an amazing amount of support coming from other car dealers in the area, because they all support the schools, and feel it is a great opportunity to get some money out of Detroit and into the community."
 Superintendent of Schools, Terrell Harrison said the school is very appreciative of Ford Motor Com-

Colby man to sit on corporation board

Ken Frahm, a Thomas County farmer who lives in Colby, has been appointed to serve a four-year term on the board of the Kansas Technology Enterprise Corp.
 The corporation is a private-public partnership established by the state to promote technology-based economic development. It helps Kansas entrepreneurs and companies through a statewide network designed and built to support technology research.
 Frahm said he has previously been a member of the corporation's investment committee, which evaluates new companies that may want to locate in Kansas.
 "KETC is getting better at evaluating the medical and bioscience industries," Frahm said. "The future for Kansas looks bright, and is not as slow as we think. It is a state with a good supply of reli-

able labor and open space."

 Frahm has served on many agricultural and energy initiatives, including Kansas 25x'25, an alliance which pushes "for America to get 25 percent of our energy from renewable resources like wind, solar, and biofuels by the year 2025."
 The group was started by a group of Kansas farm leaders, he said. It soon gained support from the agriculture and forestry industries across the nation. Frahm is also a member of the Kansas Energy Council and JW Prairie Windpower of Lawrence.
 He is a director of Edenspace, a company that uses plants for commercial energy and environmental applications. Edenspace says its technology bioengineers plants with increased biomass and stored enzymes that can reduce the costs of producing renewable fuels and chemicals from nonfood parts,

KU researchers study robots for the elderly

LAWRENCE (AP) — Researchers are trying to provide some high-tech assistance for the elderly. University of Kansas psychology professor James Juola is part of a team reprogramming a French-made robot to help aging adults who need help.
 Juola says in a news release that a rapidly aging population in the developed world requires a technological solution.

Juola splits his time between the University of Kansas and the Eindhoven University of Technology in the Netherlands.
 He's a lead investigator in the Knowledgeable Service Robots for the Aging project, dubbed K-SERA. Juola says the robot will remind people of things they need to do, like taking their medicine. It also will be able to summon help if someone falls down.
