Police say officers responding to a disturbance call at Falcon Field municipal airport in Mesa found

the 33-year-old man in the grove next to the airport, holding a green jug to his lips.

Officers say they recognized the smell of spray paint and noticed paint on Henio's upper lip.

Police say Henio admitted to sniffing paint. He also admitted to throwing oranges at the planes, saying he didn't know why it was a big deal.
