## Eagles' players make league team

Four Colby High football players were voted to the Great West Activities Conference All-League team and one received honorable mention.

Senior Andrew Flanagin was voted all-league at running back and linebacker. The other Colby players that were selected include: senior offensive guard Josh Middleton, senior wide receiver Corbin Stephens and senior free safety Kale Arnberger. Senior defensive tackle Logan Middleton received honorable mention.

Flanagin rushed for nine touchdowns and averaged 107 yards per game. He gained a total of 963 yards on 40 carries this season.

"He has one heck of a stiff arm," coach Chris Gardner said.

Flanagin was Colby's leading tackler on defense, averaging 11.3 tackles per game, edging out fellow senior linebacker Ryan Parker, who averaged 11.1 tackles. He had 102 tackles this season: 52 individual and 50 assisted.

Stephens caught eight touch-

touchdown reception at Russell that propelled the Eagles to a 48-40 win in their last game of the season. The senior wide receiver caught 21 passes for 449 yards for an average of almost 50 yards per

Arnberger intercepted three passes, recovered a fumble and averaged almost eight tackles per game. He had a total of 70 tackles: 33 individual, 37 assisted.

Gardner said Josh Middleton had great technique at guard.

Logan Middleton started the year at linebacker, but moved to defensive tackle. Gardner said he really had a motor. Middleton had six tackles a game.

The coaches from the league voted for the players. Gardner said the top vote-getters made allleague and players had to receive at least two votes to receive honorable mention. He said coaches couldn't vote for their own players. The five other teams in the conference are Hugoton, Holcomb, Goodland, Ulysses and Scott City.
