Dance Club

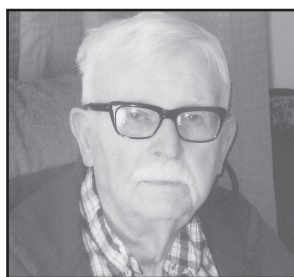
