Colby girls beat Hays

The Lady Eagles basketball team managed to win its home opener against Hays High 41-25 on Tuesday at the Community Building, despite shooting only about 22 percent from the field.

The Colby High School girls got their extra points from the free-throw line, making 17 of 24. The Lady Indians made an abysmal 3-of-20 free throws. The Lady Eagles out-rebounded their opponents 38-29. Colby committed 13 turnovers and Hays 20.

Both teams made 11 field goals, but Colby took 17 more shots than the Lady Indians. Hays shot about 32 percent from the field.


Colby controlled the early part of the game and led 9-2 at the end of the first quarter. Kaus got another rebound and stuck it back in, giving Colby a 12-4 lead in the second quarter. Then Hays' Taylor Herman banked in a shot, cutting the lead to 12-6. The Lady Eagles led 13-9 at the half.

Bell drilled a jumper in the lane and got a layup off a steal in the third and Colby led 22-16 going into the final quarter.

Senior Katherine Kaus, Katrina's twin sister, knocked down a three-pointer a few minutes into fourth, giving Colby a 28-18 lead. Hockersmith found Katrina Kaus with an inbounds pass near the basket for a layup.


