#### Brownback selects adjutant general

TOPEKA (AP) - Kansas. Gov.-elect Sam Brownback has nominated a federal official to serve as the state Highway Patrol's superintendent and a state legislator to serve as the head of the Kansas National

Brownback on Friday announced his selection of Ernest Garcia as the patrol's leader and state Rep. Lee Tafanelli as state adjutant general. Both appointments must be confirmed by the Kansas Senate.

Garcia will return to Kansas from Washington, where he's been serving in the management of the U.S. Selective Service System, including as its acting director.

Tafanelli, of Ozawkie, is a colonel in the Army National Guard who's been serving as assistant adjutant general since July. His promotion to brigadier general is awaiting approval from the U.S. Senate.




