delivered the baccalaureate address and received the university's Charles Bessey Medal.

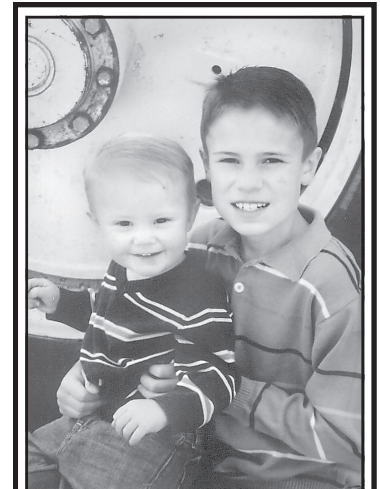
