### **Famous Hand**

This deal was played in an international pair championship. With Walter Avarelli and Massimo D'Alelio of Italy North-South, and Kenneth Konstam and Maurice Harrison-Gray of England East-West, the bidding went as shown.

Harrison-Gray, West, led the king of spades on which Konstam, East, played the nine! Ordinarily, the nine - an unnecessarily high spot card would be regarded as a request for West to continue the suit. That's how almost everyone plays, and that's how Harrison-Gray interpreted the nine. But when he led another spade, D'Alelio ruffed and made the contract, discarding a diamond on dummy's fourth club. A diamond shift would, of course, have done South in.

Obviously, Harrison-Gray and Konstam were operating on different wavelengths. Konstam intended the spade nine as a signal for a diamond shift – the higher-ranking of the two remaining side suits (clubs and diamonds). This was consistent with the suit-preference signals Konstam normally played in situations of this type.

It can be argued that Harrison-Gray should have led a diamond at trick two anyway – despite what he thought was a come-on signal in spades - because he could gauge from the bidding that declarer probably had no more spades. The answer to this, if we accept Harrison-

Gray's contention that there can be no such thing as a suit-preference signal at trick one, is that Konstam was requesting a spade continuation simply because he did not want any other suit led. However, a more practical answer is this: Once

two players agree to play together in an important championship, they should discuss in advance any and all methods of defense they plan to use. One cannot expect harmonious results when the trombone is playing Sousa and the cello is playing Beethoven.


