The Trojans' record currently sits at 9-5. The Trojans' offense features a combination of slick guard play and solid contributions from the team's forwards. The Trojans average 81 points a

The play of freshmen guards Kevin Jefferson and A.J. Barber has also been critical to the Trojans' success this season.

Jefferson averages about 8 points a game and Barber averages a little over 9 and has a team-high 35 assists this season. Jefferson played a nearly flawless game in the teams most effective blocker the Trojans' 72-63 victory against Southeast Community College of Nebraska at the Ambassador Classic tournament in Colby. He scored 21 points on 9-of-11 shooting, including knocking down 3 of 4 three pointers. Barber has consistently scored in double figures, between 11 and 17, in almost every game. The Trojans get almost 12 steals per game while their opponents get 4. Jefferson leads the team with 29 steals and Barber 24. Colby has 48 blocks this season, Morris accounts for almost half, while its opponents only have 22 rejections. Morris is far and away with 21.

Colby pulls down about 36 rebounds per game, about five more than its opponents. They also turn the ball over almost 13 times a game, about six less than their opponents.

The Trojans are shooting about 35 percent from the three-point line and 62 percent from the freethrow line. Freshman Scott Ochs has the team's highest free-throw percentage of about 89 percent, making 8 of 9 from the line.


