## Landfill the worst end for old Christmas trees

The answer to whether real "greener" can depend on whether your viewpoint is short- or long-

"A farm-grown Christmas tree has real ecological advantages," said Amy Jordan, horticulturist with Kansas State University. "While growing for six to eight years, it shelters wildlife, traps carbon dioxide and produces oxygen. After harvest, it's 100 percent biodegradable."

If buried in a landfill, however, a real tree takes up space and degrades slowly. It becomes a benefit only if recycled for mulch, fish or wildlife habitat, erosion control

'Fortunately, estimates run from 65 to 93 percent for the number of real-tree buyers who recycle,"

"That's because many Americans buy from out-of-state farmers," Jordan added.

"Usually, the problem then is just that they've lost their looks," Jordan said.

Burning artificial trees can be hazardous, but recycling is all but impossible. Plastics may break down on their own, but that requires centuries, Jordan said.

> Today's artificial trees also are likely to have PVC or polyvinyl chloride content. It still shows up as filler in most new moldedfrom-life trees that carry the PE (polyethylene) label and look so realistic. PVC and its additives are associated with serious toxins, Jordan said, and child safety groups are working to ban it in toys.

> "In the United States, PVC is probably best known for its uses in construction - including lawn irrigation systems," Jordan said. "So, at the very least, you'd have to say we've been producing a lot of it without having a good way to recycle or dispose of it. And that has to include our look-alike, but
