
Weather Corner

owned by western Kansas rural electric co-ops, while Power and Light is a private, investor-owned utility serving greater Kansas City.

Susan McMahan, who supervises emergency management, safety and communications for the county, requested a change in her official title of Emergency Management Director/Work Safety Advisor/911 Coordinator, to comply with federal and state requirements for simplicity when she applies for grants. The commissioners approved the request to change her title to just Emergency Management Director.

County Attorney Bruce Flipse told commissioners that 30 to 33 parcels on the list for the coming delinquent tax sale are fractional mineral interests. Most of the money owed, \$350,000 to \$400,000, has been paid since the county began preparations and advertising for the sale last year.

He said an instruction sheet stapled to the front of the sales lists detailing the procedures the county will take to make the sale final. As far as he can determine right now, he said, the abstracting cost of \$125 per parcel, deed and title filing fees of \$8 each and all of the 2010 taxes will be added to the bidding

price of parcels being sold.

Flipse said he will meet with the commissioners on Monday to get approval for the procedure before the sale next Friday. He said he had hired Steve Bugbee to be the auctioneer.

Road and Bridge Supervisor Clair Schrock discussed bids for mowing 2,760 "swath miles" of county roads with the commissioners. He said there has been some interest but only one person has actually picked up the bid form. Others have indicated an interest, he said. Bid opening will be on Monday, Feb. 7, during the commissioners' regular meeting.
