Make the resolutions. Feel a little guilty the first time you break one. Feel worse the second or third time. And by April, you have forgotten what resolutions you might have made. Except for a dedicated few, New Year's resolutions are just promises waiting to be broken.

Promises are interesting things. I think we're more likely to break those we make quietly to ourselves, rather than those we make public. If you break one, who knows besides yourself?

We are probably more faithful to promises we make to others. It's often harder to let down another person. But so often we make wellintentioned promises, only to find ourselves failing to keep our word. Sometimes there's a good reason. More often there is not.

Robert Frost would often visit colleges and give poetry readings and answer students'

questions. After he read his famous poem, "Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening," which ends with "promises to keep, and miles to go before I sleep," a student's hand went

"What was the promise?" he asked.

Frost replied, "If I had wanted you to know, would have told you."

Promises made, but not revealed. It's easier to break promises if we keep them hidden from others. We feel less guilty if New Year's resolutions fall by the wayside if no one else is in on what they might be.

But God does things differently. Aways has; always will. God made very public the divine promise of forgiveness, restoration and redemption in the person of Jesus Christ. With the Incarnation, with Jesus' birth, God shows the world not only the promise, but its fulfill-

Here, in the baby whose birth we have just celebrated, the great promise of God, "I will be your God, and you will be my people," is made real, made visible, for all the world to

see and to know. With the coming of Jesus, we know God will not renege on the promise to give us a savior, a messiah, who will show us the way to salvation.

The promise was made. The promise has been kept.

It is too easy to put away the promise of Christmas along with the decorations. The carols have been sung, the gifts exchanged, the cookies made and eaten. Now it's back to business as usual, acting as if nothing has changed. But in the coming of Christ, everything has changed, and keeps on changing, because God's ultimate promise is that God is always making all things new - you, me, the world, all things.

We can either claim God's great promise in Christ – or not. We can either allow ourselves to be new creations in Christ, or let the sameold same-old happen in our lives. We can either look to Christ for our example of fulness in our living, abundance in our giving, and gracefilled eternity in our dying, or we can go on as if nothing new had ever really happened.

It's a new year. A promise has been made and kept. And God has told us, shown us emphatically what that promise is.

A new thing has already begun. Will you claim it – or just pack it away for another year? Will you let God's always and forever resolution be made real in your life? After all, it is a new year.
