westbound traffic. Wanjigi's car hit a 2000 Ford Taurus driven by Steven Barnes, 65, of Marietta, Ga. Wanjigi was taken to Citizens with possible injuries; Barnes was not injured.

The Thomas County Sheriff's Depart-

ment worked several wrecks Sunday, including a three-car accident at 4 p.m. on I-70 at milepost 57 and a slide-off at 1:47 p.m. on U.S. 83 near the elevator at Breton. Undersheriff Mark Finley said there were no injuries. No further accidents had been reported as of this morning.

Kansas Department of Transportation road condition maps showed snowpacked and icy roads throughout the state today, but no roads were closed.

Schools, however, were closed this morning and Meals of Wheels was not delivering food. Colby Middle School cancelled a seventh and eighth grade scholars bowl tournament that had been scheduled for today.

The National Weather Service has issued a Wind Chill Watch for today and Tuesday morning. A Wind Chill Watch means the combination of cold air and strong winds is enough to create dangerously low temperatures. The wind chill was anywhere from 10 to 15 degrees below zero this morning, but it improved during the day. The chill factor is expected to increase again as the sun goes down. The wind will also create areas of blowing snow, reducing visibility on the roads.

The service also issued a Winter Weather Advisory, meaning that snow and blowing snow could cause travel difficulties, in effect until 6 p.m.

The forecast predicted light or moderate snow in the morning gradually tapering off during the day.

The snow may be good news for farmers, though. Extension Agent Clint Milliman said that although the wheat crop is dormant, moisture from the snow will find its way into the soil, which will help the wheat grow when it comes out of dormancy in the spring. Thomas County and the rest of western Kansas are still under drought conditions, however, since total moisture is still below the normal amount.

Milliman said the snow also will be good for fall crops, since they need moist soil for planting this spring.

But tea party activists in the state said the man identified as the suspect did not appear on mailing lists and did not appear to have attended any events in the state.

"I don't think his ideology is anything coherent," said Trent Humphries, co-founder of the Tucson Tea Party. "I just think he was a very, very disturbed individual."

Arizona Rep. Gabrielle Giffords rowly won re-election in November against a tea party-backed candidate who campaigned against the health care law. The suspected shooter registered as an independent in 2006, and he voted in the November 2008 presidential election, according to the secretary of state.

At an event about three years ago, Giffords took a question from Loughner: "What is government if words have no meaning?"

Loughner was angry about her response – she read the question and had nothing to say, according to two of his high school friends who spoke on condition of anoavoid the publicity surrounding the case.
