has declined, an estimated 4,210 women died from cervical cancer in the U.S. last year. In Kansas women, cervical cancer accounts for approximately 2 percent of all cancer, with an average of 107 new cases diagnosed each year. About 33 Kansas women die of cervical cancer every year.

"More African American and Hispanic women get cervical cancer and are diagnosed at later stages of the disease than women of other races or ethnicities, possibly because of decreased access to Pap testing or follow-up treatment," Eberhart-Phillips said. "It is important for women of all

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends vaccination for girls at age 11 or 12 years, or on a catch-up basis for females aged 13 to 26, to Although the number of cases help prevent cervical cancer later in life. Parents are encouraged to talk with their daughter's physician for more information.

The department promotes cervical cancer screening for all women. The Early Detection Works program provides breast and cervical cancer screening for uninsured women 40 to 64 who meet income guidelines through contracting providers across the state.
