Men's team struggles on offense

The Trojans men's basketball team just couldn't get much to fall in a 57-46 loss to Garden City on Monday at the Community Building.

The Colby College team's shooting woes, combined with a big rebounding disparity, proved to be too much for the Trojans to overcome. The Trojans shot 16 for 61, about 26 percent were outrebounded 41-27. All those rebounds hurt the Colby team.

"They got a lot of second opportunities in the second half," coach Dustin Pfeifer said. "They got extra shots at important times.

The Trojans held the Broncbusters to about 38 percent from the field overall, but Garden City shot about 58 percent in the second half. Sophomore Terrell Bruce led

the team in scoring with 10 points, including two crucial three-pointers that gave Colby a chance to win in the final minutes. The sophomore's two threes turned an 8-point deficit into a 2-point game. Neither team got off to a hot start

on offense. Freshman Kevin Jefferson knifed through Garden City's defense and made a layup, giving Colby a 4-3 lead early in the first half. This remained the score for 7 1/2 minutes into the half.

Sophomore Michael Morris fell to the floor clutching his ankle early in the half and had to be helped off the court. He returned a few minutes later, but the fall appeared to hinder his jumping ability. Pfeifer said Morris is OK and will play through the injury, adding that he practiced the next day. Later on, freshman Carson Kon-

rade knocked down two three pointers to make it 14-5 Colby. Then the Trojans went through a phase where they just couldn't get anything to fall, allowing the Broncbusters to go on a 10-0 run. Mike Morales of Garden City

grabbed a rebound and put it back

fashioned three-point play by making his free throw. Freshman Marty Wendel knocked down a jumper from the right elbow, ending Colby's drought and tying the game at 16. Freshman Vincent Dillard scored inside while drawing a foul with 1:15 left in the half. He made the free throw and the Trojans led 21-18. Colby led 23-18 at the half.

Bruce knocked down a three pointer and freshman Hurley Johnson drilled a jumper early in the half. Morris grabbed a rebound and scored while drawing contact from a defender, tying the game at 36 with 9:38 left. He made his free throw to put Colby up by one.

Later on, the Broncbusters' Jarin while getting fouled, tying the wand Rheubottom scored two quick game at 14. He completed the old buckets to make it 44-39 Garden

City with 6:27 left. The Broncbusters extended their lead to 47-39 before a three by Bruce narrowed the gap to 5. Bruce drilled another three-pointer about a minute later to make it 47-45. Garden City scored the next four

points to go up by 6 with 1:38 left. The Broncbusters hit some free throws down the stretch and picked up a 57-46 win. Dillard had 6 points and Morris

and Johnson chipped in 5 each. With the loss, Colby dropped to 10-9 and 1-4 in the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference. They will play Butler County

Community College at 7:30 p.m. tonight in El Dorado.
