Ogle has 30 years of experience in writing drama and directing theater. He said this production came out in 2005, and he has directed it once before. However, he believes it has never been performed in this area.

“We’ve already experienced our first blessing,” he said. “When I explained to one of the school patrons that we would be needing lots of lumber and carpet to extend the school’s stage, he led me to a huge amount of lumber that would be everything we needed for the stage, including more for props – and it was free. Legislators propose deeper budget cuts

private sector jobs. Carter predicted some state employees would leave government work if the cuts weren’t restored.

The 7.5 percent cut in wages would save state government more than \$16 million, but half of that money would be retained by the Kansas Board of Regents to be used to fund deferred maintenance projects on college campuses.

It is unclear how quickly the House will debate the spending bill. Senators are working on their own version in committee. Both bills would have to be reconciled and

approved by both chambers before going to Brownback. The Republican governor has asked that the cuts be on his desk by the end of the month, if possible.

The plan also cuts aid to the 289 public school districts by \$75 per pupil this year, reducing the amount from \$4,012 to \$3,937, or approximately \$86 million.

The committee rejected an effort to increase funding by more than \$16 million for the current year to avoid possible loss of federal funding for special education in 2013.

Democrats said Kansas could lose as much as \$70 million in future budget years

if it didn’t maintain its funding levels for education as required by the federal stimulus act. The act required states to maintain its education budgets at 2006 levels in exchange for receiving federal stimulus dollars over the past two years.

“I think the governor should be concerned that members of his side of the aisle don’t have faith in him being able to bring a rescission bill that he worked on to pass,” said Rep. Bill Feuerborn, a Garnett Democrat and ranking minority member on the appropriations committee. “Why take a chance of losing almost \$70 million in education funding?”

Landon Fulmer, Brownback’s policy director, said it was unclear if Kansas would be penalized for not spending more on education, adding that the state did receive a waiver in previous years from the federal government when state spending levels dropped.

One cut would eliminate state tax dollars for publications and membership dues for agencies, including membership in the National Council of State Legislatures. Committee members suggested the fees be paid from other sources. Senate President Steve Morris, a Hugoton Republican, is scheduled to become president of NCSL in August.

Speech frames 2012 debate

WASHINGTON – President Barack Obama took a significant step toward retooling his presidency with a challenge to lawmakers to rise above partisan differences to tackle economic and budget problems “decades in the making.”

And while there remained stark differences in approach between the president and the Republicans with whom he now shares power, Obama made some striking concessions in the name of national unity – and asked others to do the same.

In a State of the Union address made somber by the recent Arizona shootings, Obama on Tuesday night coupled a call for budget restraint with a plea for more American innovation to allow the United States to better compete in the global economy.

to include nuclear and so-called “clean coal.”

“At stake is whether new jobs and industries take root in this country, or somewhere else,” Obama said. “To win the future, we’ll need to take on challenges that have been decades in the making.”

At the same time, Obama proposed deficit-cutting steps, including a five-year freeze in spending for some domestic programs. And he called for a reduction in the taxes corporations pay but “without raising the deficit.”

Republicans scoffed at Obama’s concept of “investments” and suggested the president was merely seeking to continue a longtime spending spree. They’ve put tackling the nation’s \$14 trillion debt at the center of their agenda, beginning with spending cuts larger and sooner than Obama has proposed.

Obama needs to win back independent voters, who helped him win the presidency in 2008 but deserted Democratic candidates in favor of Republicans in last November’s midterm elections.

Despite their new clout, Republicans, too, are mindful that repeating the gains they made last November in the 2012 election cycle won’t be a cakewalk – and need to avoid the possibility of gridlock.
