Fungicide update meeting here

Farmers who feel their wheat should have produced more last year or that stripe rust decreased their yield need to attend an informational meeting next Wednesday on wheat, corn, soybean, and sunflower fungicide.

The Fungicide Update meeting will be offered from 1 to 4 p.m. at the Thomas County 4-H Building at the fairgrounds.

Presented by Thomas County Extension and K-State Research and Extension, featured speakers will be wheat plant pathologist Erick DeWolf and row crop specialist Doug Jardine, both of K-State.

Topics include 2010 production issues; fungicides: how they work, how well, on what and when and how to apply; and cost versus benefit. Specific questions will be discussed, as well as possible problem scenarios for crops in 2011.

Reservations are required by Monday and can be made by calling the Thomas County Extension Office at 460-4582.

There must be at least 10 people pre-registered to hold the program.

Science and math workshop aimed at girls

Hands-on workshops and information about careers are highlights of a one-day seminar at Emporia State University for middle-school girls interested in science and mathematics.

Registrations for "Expanding Your Horizons in Science and Mathematics" are due by Thursday, Feb. 3, for the seminar on March 5.

"This workshop empowers young women by giving them an opportunity to meet and form personal contacts with women working in mathematics and science-related careers," said Betsy Yanik, professor in the Department of Mathematics, Computer Science and Economics at the university.

The day begins with registration at 8 a.m. and concludes at 3 p.m. The morning includes three career discussion sections, and the afternoon includes two hands-on workshops.

There are 18 choices for career exploration including health care and engineering as well as forensic science and paleobotany or exploring plant fossils. Workshops include computer animation, designing and building roller coasters and analyzing river water and building water filters.

Sessions are planned for adults, too, including hands-on workshops and discussing how to support students interested in math and science.

Registration is limited to 220 students and 50 adults and costs \$15 for students in grades six through eight and \$25 for adults. The fee includes lunch, T-shirts and conference materials. Preference will be given to first-time attendees.

Payment is by mailed check only. There will be no on-site registrations.
