Conservation Reserve Program not affect cropped acres for this will begin on Monday, March 14, and continue through Friday, April 15. This is the second consecutive year the U.S. Department of Agriculture has offered a general

"Over the past 25 years, support for CRP has grown thanks to strong backing from farmers, ranchers, conservationists, hunters, fishermen and other outdoor sports enthusiasts," said Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack. "Not only has CRP contributed to ... water and air quality, it has preserved habitat for wildlife, and prevented soil erosion by protecting the most sensitive areas including those prone to flash flooding and runoff.'

Through the program, eligible landowners receive annual rental payments and cost-share assistance to establish resource-conserving covers on farmland. Land can be enrolled for up to 15 years.

During the general signup period, farmers and ranchers may offer land currently not enrolled at county Farm Service Agency office. Current participants with contracts expiring this fall may make new contract offers. Contracts under this signup are begin now and 2014.

Farm Service implements the program on behalf of Commodity Credit Corporation, evaluating and ranking offers using an index that shows the environmental benefits to be gained from enrolling the land. It looks at wildlife, water, soil, air and enduring benefits and cost. Decisions will be made after sign-up ends and after analyzing the data of all the offers.

In addition to the general signup, the continuous sign-up program will continue for the most environmentally desirable and sensitive land. For more information, visit www.fsa.usda.gov/crp.

The program protects topsoil from erosion and is designed to safeguard natural resources by reducing water runoff and sedimentation, protecting groundwater and improving the condition of lakes, rivers and streams. Enrolled acreage is planted to vegetative covers, contributing to increased wildlife populations.

Through the 2008 Farm Bill, the program is authorized for a maximum of 32 million acres. Contracts on 3.3 million to 6.5 million acres will expire annually between


