Critics say fraud law would hurt voters

edly be concerned if even a single fraudulent vote is cast, we should be even more concerned if even a single legal voter is disenfranchised," said Kevin Myles, president of the NAACP's state chap-

The committee heard criticism of Kobach's bill from a representative of the National Organization for Women, who said it would create hardships for working women who've changed their names, either by marriage or divorce, or for people who were adopted. A board member for the Kansas Equality Coalition said the bill would create new obstacles for people undergoing gender reassignment

Several witnesses said enacting Kobach's proposals would end door-to-door and other community voter registration drives, because the bill says election officials are to reject any registration that is not accompanied by proof of citizenship. Myles said Kobach's bill represented "a failure of due diligence."

"While I do believe that, you know, we need to take all necessary steps to make sure that our elections are secure, I think that we first ought to look internally to see, are there administrative practices that could be changed to do that?" he said.

Last month, Kobach released a report saying his office has received 59 reports of alleged irregularities involving at least 221 ballots since 1997 – twice as many as documented by an internal report

three years ago drafted for one of his predecessors. And Kobach suggested those reports represent perhaps only 10 percent of what's actually occurred.

Kobach won last year's election with 59 percent of the vote after "While we should all undoubt- making fighting election fraud the biggest issue of his campaign, despite continued skepticism that it's a widespread problem in Kansas.

Committee Chairman Scott Schwab, an Olathe Republican, said many GOP legislative candidates agreed with Kobach's assessment of election fraud as a significant issue and supported photo ID and proof-of-citizenship requirements.

"A lot of people campaigned on this," Schwab said after Wednesday's hearing. "To say, well, we're not going to do it, I think, is a little bit of a stretch."

Kobach said some of the issues raised Wednesday by critics of the bill, such as potential obstacles in registering to vote faced by women who remarry or divorce, people who were adopted as children or people undergoing gender reassignment surgery, can be addressed with administrative rules.

He said he'd accept language in the bill to clarify that voter registration forms and copies of documents providing proof of citizenship don't have to be submitted to election officials simultaneously for a registration to be valid, which he says is his intent.

And he said his office is working on administrative solutions to some problems, such as making sure that the names of people who've moved or died are removed more quickly from counties' voter registration rolls.

"There's no reason why we can't move on both tracks at once," he

Senate panel considers profiling law changes

TOPEKA - Kansas law enforcement officials urged a Senate panel Wednesday to consider policing, including training and the due process of officers if the Legislature makes any changes to a 2004 law aimed at protecting

Among the proposed changes to the 2004 law are the name itself. Rather than referring to racial profiling it would be labeled biased policing, a term used by courts and law enforcement. The new definition includes the unreasonable use of race, ethnicity, national origin, gender and religious dress in combination with other factors

Other changes would require community boards to work with law enforcement to prevent biased data collection. Law enforcement agencies also would be required to have a comprehensive plan for training officers and handling al-

Steve Bukaty, attorney for the Kansas Fraternal Order of Police, the new proposals must be a balance struck between protecting the rights of Kansas residents with the due process of law enforcement officers alleged to commit biased policing.

But Sen. Oletha Faust-Goudeau said the definition doesn't need to change or its intent will be lost. She said the goal in 2004 was to prevent bias against blacks by law enforcement who many felt were targeted simply because of their

"I think it's a step backward," the Wichita Democrat said. "This is a real issue for the people who as part of a specific description as feel they are racially profiled."

Faust-Goudeau has spoken previously on the issue from her experience as a black woman being stopped late at night while driving through her neighborhood. She contends race factored in the traffic stop.

She said if there are concerns about Hispanics or Muslims being targeted by police action based on religion or ethnicity then Kansas should have a separate law for those instances, but the racial pro filing definition should remain.

But not every instance deserves a stand-alone law, said Sen. Tim Owens, an Overland Park Republican.

"I don't think we need to have another one, but I understand her concern," Owens said. "Every group would like to have their status singled out."

Klump said there are other costs that can't be ignored. He said 72 percent of Kansas law enforcement agencies have 10 or fewer officers and 50 percent have five or fewer. Smaller forces require schedule changes and paying of overtime to ensure that communities have 24-hour protection, he

The bill addresses that issue by allowing training over distance learning systems, such as closed circuit television or the Internet to keep officers in town.
