Saving tax refund easy with planning

Tax time is just around the corner. Some of you may already have your taxes filed. The rest of us need to get things together and get them done. Are you one of the lucky ones expect-

ing a refund? Do you normally get a refund and it's gone before you know it? If that sounds too familiar, you'll be interested in a way to make it last longer. The Internal Revenue Service allows you to split your refund into different accounts.

This split refund option can help you save money. You know using payroll withholding is a simple way to save money - because once a paycheck hits your checking account, it often doesn't last long. Now, taxpayers like you can use the same saving strategy to make your tax refund last longer.

A tax refund is the single biggest lump sum of money many Americans receive all year. With the option to deposit the refund in up to three accounts, you can pay some bills, save for an emergency, and put some away for retirement.

By filling out IRS Form 8888 you have the choice of directing your refund to one, two or three accounts such as checking, savings, and retirement accounts (like an IRA, or individual retirement account). All you have to do is to supply accurate account and routing numbers. Before setting up the direct deposit, check that the financial institution accepts direct deposits for the designated is available whether taxpayers file electronically or by mail. This can be an easy way to help you start or to boost your emergency fund or retirement account.

Now on a different topic, something to be wary of when you have your taxes prepared is a tax anticipation loan to receive your tax refund faster. Getting a quick refund is convenient, but it comes with a cost. They're not free.

Tax anticipation loans are expensive and can have interest rates well over 200 percent and are usually loaded with fees. That's a lot of money to pay for receiving your tax refund only 10 to 14 days early. In January, the National Consumer Law Center and the

consumer Federation of America issued a press release with this statement: "Some of America's most cash-strapped taxpayers those from low- and moderateincome families – spent nearly \$1 billion in the latest year recorded for what is almost always an unnecessary product: the so-called "refund anticipation loan" at income tax time.

The newest figures reveal these loans cost taxpayers \$960 million in loan fees, plus over \$100 million in other fees. These fees came straight out of the wallets of nearly 9.6 million American taxpayers

Taxpayers can save themselves over a billion dollars by just saying "NO" to quick tax refund loans. These loans take a chunk out of your hard-earned tax refund, and expose you to the risk of unmanageable debt if your refund doesn't arrive as expected.

Given the facts, it is smart to say "No" to tax anticipation loans and wait for your full refund.


