Careful record-keeping needed for pesticides

To prepare for the application of various pesticides this spring - herbicides, fungicides or insecticides - this is a good time to review U.S. Department of Agriculture requirements for pesticide record

Although the record-keeping requirements apply only to restricted-use pesticides, it is a good idea to keep quality records for all pesticide applications.

The Food, Agriculture, Conservation and Trade Act of 1990, commonly called the 1990 Farm Bill, says private applicators must record any restricted-use pesticides they apply. Under the act, application records must be kept for two years from the date of application. The certified

applicator should keep these records and must be able to make them accessible for copying by regulatory and medical representatives.
