Over twenty years ago a book was on the bestseller lists for quite a while, titled "All I Really Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten" (Robert Fulghum, Villard Books, 1988). It's the whimsical recollections and musings of a homespun philosopher who offers his readers some humorous and the meaning of everyday life. He

"Each spring ... I have set myself the task of writing a personal statement of belief.... Recently, I realized that I already know most of what's necessary.... Here's my Credo: All I really need to know ... I learned in kindergarten. Wisdom was not at the top of the graduate school mountain, but there in the sandpile at Sunday School.... I learned: Share everything. Play fair. Don't hit people.... Clean up your mess....

Fulghum continues, "Take any one of those ... into sophisticated adult terms and apply it ... and it holds true and clear and firm."

If I were to write a book like Fulghum's, I might title it "My dad, My Hero" with a subtitle of "Everything I needed to know about life, I learned from my dad."

And then it hit me that I had learned the importance of asking for and receiving forgiveness by watching when the same thing had happened to my dad. I learned to understand that stress and pressure can cause you to

say things you don't really mean, and the way to handle it is with honestly admitting you blew it and asking for forgiveness.

He taught me that real Christians aren't perfect, just forgiven. My dad could lose his temper. But he never failed, when he blew it, to make it right.

What it cost him in terms of his pride, I don't know. What it gained him in terms of the respect of his kids and his congregation and his community - that I know.

My dad taught me a simple principle by his life and his words - always do the right thing, even if you think no one will know or care if you do the wrong thing. And if for some reason you've done the wrong thing, apologize, make it right immediately. My dad taught me how to be a man of integrity.


