

Lady Eagles' runner keeps up winning ways

Colby High School junior Emilia Finley continued to dominate the 1600-meter and 800-meter runs, helping her team to a second-place finish at Garden City on Tuesday.

Finley placed first in the 1600 meters with 5 minutes, 27.5 seconds, and first in the 800 meters with 2:22.2. She also placed fourth in the pole vault with a leap of 8 feet.

Brenna McKee placed first in the long jump for the second time in a row with a leap of 16 feet, 5 inches. Morgan Bell scored another win in the high jump with 5 feet and Katrina Kaus placed first in the 3200 meters. Kaus also placed second in the 1600 meters, 13 seconds behind Finley.

The girls junior varsity relay team of Shelby Gardner, Skylar Barrett, Kortney Bredemeier and Katie Elias placed first with 56.43. The junior varsity team came in sixth overall.

Other varsity scores included: Paige Roopchan, fourth in the 100-meter hurdles with 16.97, fourth in the long jump with 15 feet, 8.5 inches and third in the triple jump with 33 feet, 11.25 inches.

The 4-by-400 relay team of Corbin Stephens, Wiatt Binder, Austin Schiedeman and Kale Aramberger placed sixth with 3:37.22. Aramberger also placed third in the 400 meters with 52.73 and Logan Middleton placed fourth in the javelin with 157 feet, 10 inches.

On the junior varsity side, the team came in ninth. The 4-by-

John Faber placed fifth in the 3200 meters with 11:30.9 and Connor Schwanke, tied for third in the high jump with 5 feet, 2 inches. Ryan Moore got fifth in the long jump with 17 feet, 2.5 inches and Jared Nally tied for sixth in the pole vault with 8 feet.
