

Ask Dr. Brothers

Know when to get between

Dear Dr. Brothers: I'm three months into a cool relationship. We are both 23 and started off as friends in school before things got hot and heavy. I was wondering - am I too protective worrying about the way she and her brother fight? I've been on the phone with her when they've been having it out, and at least once he hit her. It made me extremely angry, and I wanted to punch him. I don't know whether to get involved. - L.D.

Dear L.D.: You have the right instincts as a boyfriend who loves his girlfriend and wants to protect her. That should make you feel good. But you need to talk about this. It's difficult to be thrown into a situation where you don't know the background of the relationship, only that it's wrong to hit a woman. But your girlfriend and her brother might not see it that way, and that could be a dangerous attitude for her. It seems likely the behavior you are witnessing grew naturally out of a rough-and-tumble childhood in which hitting and other physical stuff were accepted.

You should ask her about this so you have a clear picture of where these two are coming from. While they are acting like 12-year-olds, let them know you can't tolerate that kind of behavior. Tell them you believe that if they continue, it could have bad consequences. For one, it could lead to your sister looking for an abusive man in her life, and you're not applying for the job. If her brother gets angry, you may find you have bitten off more than you can chew with this family.


Dear Dr. Brothers: My mother is both religious and logical. Her mantra has always been "If your faith doesn't show provable results in your life, find one that will." She's convinced the only way to let go of anger toward those who have wronged her is to pray for them. There's no debating this, yet she says she would like to prove this to me. Obviously, you can't prove things that deal with faith. Right? – M.W.

Dear M.W.: Generally speaking, I agree. But there are ways to measure effects, and one area that actually has been studied is prayer. And while there has been interest in whether prayer affects the subject of the prayers, not much thought has you hear about prayer circles, you often are made aware of the so-called power of prayer.

But can it help her feel less angry in general? A new study published by Personality and Social Psychology Bulletin would vote yes. Through experiments in which students were provoked and then asked to pray or just think about either MDTUKE, GJHE DH DCPH CU the provoker or someone else, those who prayed showed reductions in anger toward those who just thought about the enemy or another person. Prayers were seen by the researchers as an effective way of diffusing anger - as long as the prayers were benevolent, and not hostile! Would your mother consider this "proof"? Prayer helped calm people regardless of their church practices. So maybe it could help you as well.

Famous Hand

The United States scored the most lopsided victory in the 60-year history of the Bermuda Bowl, routing Brazil 506-288 in the final of the 2000 world team championship. The margin (in International Match Points) and the winning team's IMP total were both records for the event.

The 16-day competition, which started with 20 teams, came down to a showdown between the U.S. squad, composed of Bob Hamman, Paul Soloway, Jeff Meckstroth, Eric Rodwell, Nick Nickell and Richard Freeman, and Brazil's Gabriel Chagas, Marcelo Branco, Ricardo Janz, Miguel Villas-Boas, Joao-Paulo Campos and Roberto de Mello.

The final was a virtual runaway for the Americans from the outset. Today's deal resulted in a 12-IMP pickup for the winners.


At the first table, Meckstroth, playing in four hearts, won the king-of-diamonds lead with the ace and led the spade four to dummy's king. East won and returned a club to West's ace, whereupon West cashed the queen of diamonds and continued with the deuce.

Meckstroth trumped the diamond with dummy's king and ruffed a spade, felling West's queen. Declarer then drew trumps, crossed to the club queen and discarded his remaining diamond on the spade jack to make his game. At the other table, Chagas, one of the world's

great players, became declarer at the same contract. He had played nearly every deal for two weeks and showed signs of his fatigue by making the fatal mistake of drawing three rounds of trumps after taking the diamond ace at trick one. He then guessed the spade position correctly, playing the jack after West followed low. But East took the ace and returned a club to his partner's ace, and West's Q-10 of diamonds set the contract one trick.
