Brownback wants to eliminate the commission and replace it with a nonprofit foundation rely-

Legislative negotiators plan to include \$689,000 in the next budget to keep the commission alive, but Brownback is expected to line-item veto the funds.

Arts Commission Chairman Henry Schwaller says the agency was shocked by Taylor's letter. Schwaller calls the move a backdoor attempt to circumvent what Kansas residents want.


