Trojan baseball team wins Sub-Regionals

The Fort Scott Greyhounds jumped out to an early lead in the first game of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference Sub-Regional Tournament on Saturday in Colby, but once they lost it, they could never get it back.

Fort Scott ended up losing the early game to Butler County Community College 9-3. Despite Fort Scott's first-inning lead, the Grizzlies shut down the Greyhounds until the eighth and capitalized on 16 hits to pull far ahead.

Colby Community College faced Highland Community College Scotties in the second game of the tournament. Sophomore pitcher Marshall Dean threw a nine innings.

It was a tight game defensively for both teams. Colby dropped most of the Highland batters in order, but didn't score a run until the fifth inning. Freshman Austin Russell was the first to get on in the bottom of the first, reaching left on base.

In the top of the ninth, two ground outs and Dean's eighth strikeout sealed the deal for the Trojans with a final score of 6-0.


