


Dear Heloise: I purchase FRUITS AND VEG-ETABLES at my local farmers market each week. The produce is not wrapped, and before I prepare any of it, I soak it in water to which I have added 2 tablespoons of bleach. I don't know how many people have handled the produce prior to my purchasing it, and wish to be as safe as possible. – Eva Knight, via email

Washing produce is always important, especially with outbreaks of salmonella and E. coli. We checked with the Food and Drug Administration, and it does NOT RECOMMEND using bleach, soap, detergent or produce washes. They say to thoroughly "wash" all produce under only running water before using or cooking, which means to rub the surface with your hand or a vegetable brush to remove dirt, etc. If you want, you can use a clean paper towel to "scrub" the surface of delicate fruits and veggies.

Scrub firm vegetables, like potatoes, using a produce brush. Fruits with hard skins, like cantaloupe, should be scrubbed using a veggie brush under water so that bacteria don't move from the outside to the inside flesh when the skin is cut. Use a colander when washing fruit or veggies so cleaned items don't sit in dirty water. – Heloise

Dear Readers: Here are helpful hints for measuring sugar: Confectioners' or powdered sugar, typically used in frostings and icings, absorbs moisture, which causes clumping. This is why it must be sifted or fluffed before measuring, then leveled off with a smooth, flat utensil.


Brown sugar should be pressed down firmly with a spoon and then leveled off. The brown sugar should retain the shape of the cup when turned out into the bowl.


Granulated sugar can simply be placed in the measuring cup and leveled off. Happy baking! – Heloise

PINEAPPLE JUICE

Dear Heloise: I opened a can of pineapple juice one day and needed to refrigerate the remainder. Leaving it in the can causes a "tinny" taste. Since my pitcher was not available, I grabbed two clean, empty, 20-ounce water bottles and filled them with the extra juice. It keeps well in the refrigerator and can be easily shaken when it separates. The bottles take up less room than the pitcher and can be grabbed when heading out the door. – Skeeter Gurzick, Omaha, Neb.



Battle of the Sexes

In April 1989, a match billed as the "Marathon Bridge Battle of the Sexes" took place in New York and Paris. The nonstop, two-week-long, round-the-clock match between an all-male team and an all-female team, playing the same hands simultaneously at the two sites, ended in a narrow victory for the men.

The event, the brainchild of former New York Times bridge columnist Alan Truscott, established many records, including the longest continuous match (2,352 deals) and the most players participating in a match (more than 1,000). It also raised more than \$15,000 for charity.

This deal, played by R. Jay Becker (no relation to this writer) in New York, contributed to a strong comeback by the men after they had fallen behind. Becker reached four hearts as shown. East won the opening diamond lead and shifted to a trump. Declarer won and smoothly led the spade three, which rode to East's ten. The defense was now helpless.

In practice, East returned a diamond to dummy's king. Becker then drew the last trump and led another spade to East's king, endplaying her. Whether she returned a diamond or a club, declarer had the remainder.

If instead East had cashed the king of spades before returning a diamond, declarer would simply ruff a spade, cross to the eight of hearts and ruff another spade to establish a discard for his losing club.

The only chance for the defense is for West to put up the spade ace at trick three and shift to a club, playing for East to have both black kings. This is not unreasonable, since if South has the club king, he already has at least 10 tricks, while at the same time he is hardly likely to lead a low spade from his hand if he holds the king.

The same contract was beaten when the deal was played in Paris, so the men gained 10 IMPs. (c)2011 King Features Syndicate Inc.
