'Buckle up,' says the law

Seatbelts create a safe space within a vehicle that wearing seatbelts....' can prevent serious injuries and save lives, a braininjured crash victim and law enforcement officials said during the kickoff of the "Click It. Or Ticket." enforcement crackdown in Kansas.

'My parents looked at my car after the crash," said Chad Kitzman, 29, who five years ago suffered a traumatic brain injury in a one-car crash. "It looked like a tin can crushed into a ball from rolling end over end down a hill. When they looked into the vehicle where I had been sitting, that part of the car was totally intact. I would have been protected had I just fastened my seatbelt."

Kansas Highway Patrol Capt. Dek Kruger described his experience in notifying a woman that her husband and two sons had just died in a rollover crash. None of them were wearing seatbelts.

'There was room to live in that vehicle," Capt. Kruger said. "In the past three years, I have responded to and investigated 50 fatality crashes involving 58 victims. Twenty-nine of those victims were not

Kitzman, Kruger and Master Sergeant Gary Todd of the Kansas City, Kan., Police Department spoke at a May 12 event announcing the state's "Click it. Or ticket." seatbelt enforcement initiative. Law enforcement officers statewide will be working overtime to enforce the state's seatbelt law before and after the Memorial Day holiday.

Master Sergeant Todd explained that a new Kansas law passed in 2010 allows law enforcement officers to pull over any vehicle in which occupants are unrestrained. No other violation need be observed, and officers will issue a citation for the offense.

Kansas is still below the national average of 85 percent seatbelt usage, Todd said.

Kitzman added statistics show that, on average, an individual will be in four car crashes in a lifetime.

"Assuming that your next car ride could be one of those four times, you should make sure that you always buckle up, and avoid what happened to me,"






