Normally the county can't legally take action until three notices have been given, the last one being a certified letter, Berens said. In this case though, the county has been given permission by Urban's widow and sons to spray the weeds wherever necessary. Unfortunately, because it is so late in the season, spraying will not take care of the thistle completely, which has already started to bloom.

Schrock said now all they can do is disc the property and spray, which will take care of some of the thistle but, "it's a preventable solution, they need to be killed," which is a program that can be started in the fall.

In other business, the commissioners:

• Heard 2012 budget recommendations from Sheriff Rod Taylor. Taylor and the commissioners discussed what line items could be cut and where the budget could allow for increase. • Announced that the Local Environmental Protection Group would not be cut entirely from the state budget, as originally expected. The group's budget did get cut from \$73,383 in fiscal year 2011 to \$52,155 for fiscal year 2012.

• Discussed the need for a new ambulance building. The commissioners have invited Colby Mayor Gary Adrian and City Manager Carolyn Armstrong to attend a meeting on June 20 to discuss options.

"My district is perfect, one square to another," he said. "I'd hate to change anything there."

Ostmeyer said counties like Phillips or Rush could be added to his district to make up the population difference, however, he said he does not want to attach Hays to any district around it because the demographics are so different between urban and rural areas. Most Hays schools play in different classes than any others in northwest Kansas, and the high population area would dominate the politics of any large district.

House districts will also have to go up in size. Rep. Rick Billinger said the districts have been about 18,000 people each, but that could change to as high as 20,000.

Latest census data puts Billinger's 121st District at 19,000. However, between 2000 includes Sherman, Thomas, Sheridan and Graham Counties,

Billinger is not on the House redistricting committee, but said urban areas like Johnson County are likely to gain several House seats while western Kansas may

Ostmeyer said he expects Rep. Don Hineman's District 118 to be heavily affected during redistricting. District 118 includes Wallace, Logan, Wichita, Gove, Lane, Trego and Rush Counties and part of Ness County. Those counties saw population decline in the last 10 years, and Wallace, Wichita, Gove and Lane Counties each saw a decrease of more than 10 percent.

### Arizona wildfire smoke reaches Colby Tuesday

In Arizona, heavy smoke forced the closure of several roads, including about a two-mile stretch of U.S. Highway 180 between Alpine and the New Mexico line, Frenzen said.

In Springerville, the giant plume of white smoke that had billowed thousands of feet into the air turned black as dusk neared. The smell of smoke permeated the community and nerves were rattled.

Some have already left homes that are closer to the fire. Larry Hoppe was one of them.

Hoppe, who lives with his family near Nutrioso, was on vacation in Arkansas when he heard about the fire. He said his two horses were too spooked by the smoke, wind and commotion to be loaded up and had to remain at his home.

About 2,700 to 3,000 people are believed to have fled Alpine and Nutrioso late last week, Gov. Jan Brewer said.

Roughly 2,500 firefighters, including many from several western states and as far away as New York, are working to contain the fire, fire information officer Peter Frenzen said. No serious injuries have been reported.

Brewer signed an emergency declaration Monday that will allow the use of \$200,000 in emergency funds and authorizes the mobilization of the National Guard if it becomes necessary.
