## Kansas' historic preservation plan approved

The National Park Service has Act. approved a statewide historic preservation plan, says the Kansas Historical Society. The plan was unveiled at the state preservation conference, June 1-3 in Topeka. Every five years the National Park Service requires state historic preservation offices to produce statewide plans to comply with the National Historic Preservation

The plan, which is intended to guide preservation efforts and decision making both locally and regionally, is the result of a two-year process to gather input from state and federal agencies, preservation organizations and the public. The document identifies the network of organizations that contribute to the interpretation and preservation

of Kansas' cultural and natural re-

The plan identifies a series of goals that can be addressed by state and federal agencies, local governments, preservation organizations, property owners, and interested members of the public within the next five years. The goals are to broaden public knowledge about historic preservation

resources, programs, and issues; strengthen advocacy for preservation; develop a statewide preservation network; integrate historic preservation practices into community planning; and fund historic preservation initiatives.
