





Club waffles real family hit

Dear Heloise: Several years ago, you had a recipe for WAFFLES MADE WITH CLUB SODA that would freeze really well. Is it possible to print the recipe again? – Rose D., Warren, Ohio

Rose, I would be happy to share the Heloise Club Waffle recipe, which is a real favorite with you and other readers, as it is one of the most requested. These are fun to make, and they save a few calories since you are eliminating the milk. Here is what you will need:

2 cups good biscuit mix

1 egg

1/2 cup vegetable oil

1 1/3 cups club soda

Add to a hot waffle iron and voilá – light, fluffy, yummy waffles for everyone to enjoy! Go ahead and use all of the batter to make pancakes or waffles. Freeze waffles for a quick, yummy breakfast later. Just reheat. - Heloise

COFFEE HINTS

Dear Readers: Start your day off with a cup of coffee? Here are some Heloise hints about storage that you might not know:

• The right storage is important in order to ensure a good cup of coffee. Most coffee experts say DO NOT refrigerate or freeze coffee beans or fresh grounds, because moisture will cause deterioration. A cool, dark location in an air-tight container (preferably opaque glass) is best. So, not on the counter next to the stove or by a sunny window. Light, heat, air and moisture are the culprits that will ruin the coffee beans and grounds! • Purchase freshly ground coffee or beans in

smaller quantities, since it's best when used within one to two weeks. Beans actually begin to lose freshness right after roasting! But that may not be practical for some. Many people do freeze or refrigerate coffee

and do not have a problem. So, if that works for you, then do it. Enjoy! - Heloise



A Sleight-of-Hand Trick

It goes without saying that in hands other than those intended as a sacrifice, declarer should choose the line of play that gives him the best mathematical chance for the contract.

Consider this case where the defenders win the first two spades and continue with a third spade, ruffed by South. Declarer cashes the A-Q of trumps, and the question is what to do next. If he leads a low diamond to the jack and the

finesse succeeds, he makes the contract without further ado. However, the finesse offers only a 50 percent chance of success, and if it fails, the contract will almost surely fail with it. East simply returns a diamond, and South later loses a club. Declarer should not adopt this approach,


though. Instead, he should opt for a different course that raises his chances well above the 50-50 level. A much better line is to cash the A-K of clubs and play another club. One possibility is that East will win the third club, in which case South can claim the rest of the tricks, since East will be forced to make a losing return. If West wins the third club, as in the actual

deal, he must yield a ruff-and-discard or return a diamond – and if he has either the queen or ten of diamonds (or both), the contract also is secure. If West has the queen, he is automatically dead.

If he has the ten and leads it, covering with the jack eliminates the diamond loser, while if he leads a low diamond from the ten, declarer simply follows low from dummy, trapping East's Only if East has the queen and ten of diamonds
