
Celebrating Independence

Sean Hankin, Kiwanis member and assistant fire chief, said the club set up 280 mortars at the Thomas County Fairgrounds arena capable of firing three- to six-inch shells. The show also included two "finale boxes," which had about 24 shots set to launch in quick succession. Hankin said the club orders the equipment from Tri-State Fireworks in Colorado. The department has two state-licensed firefighters who do the actual firing as well as volunteers and security. A tanker truck was on duty to monitor the fireworks in case they start any fires on the ground.
