culture's Farm Service Agency is making emergency loans available to help qualified producers recover from production and physical

losses due to natural disasters. Disaster Designation S3121 for drought, excessive heat and high winds on Jan. 1 and continuing made a number of primary counties in Kansas eligible. Those in this area are Norton and Phillips. Contiguous counties also eligible are Decatur, Gove and Sheridan. Producers in these counties have until Feb. 23 to apply for an emer-

Disaster Designation S3117 for drought, and related disasters, including wildfires and high winds on Jan. 1 and continuing made primary counties eligible including Thomas and Wallace. Contiguous counties Cheyenne and Rawlins

The U.S. Department of Agri- are also eligible. Producers in these counties have until Jan. 10 to apply for an emergency loan.

Loans may be used to restore or replace essential property and pay production costs associated with the disaster year. Applicants can borrow up to 100 percent of actual production or physical losses not to exceed \$500,000. The current rate for these low-interest loans is 3.75 percent. Each loan application is considered on its own merits, taking into account the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

Producers in these counties may also be eligible for 2011-crop year Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payments. Signup for 2011 losses will be held in a future year.




